

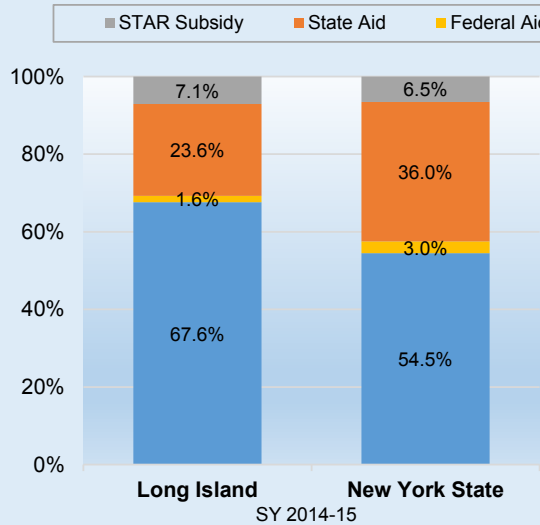
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**Regional Summary**

**Revenue Breakdown: Region vs. State**



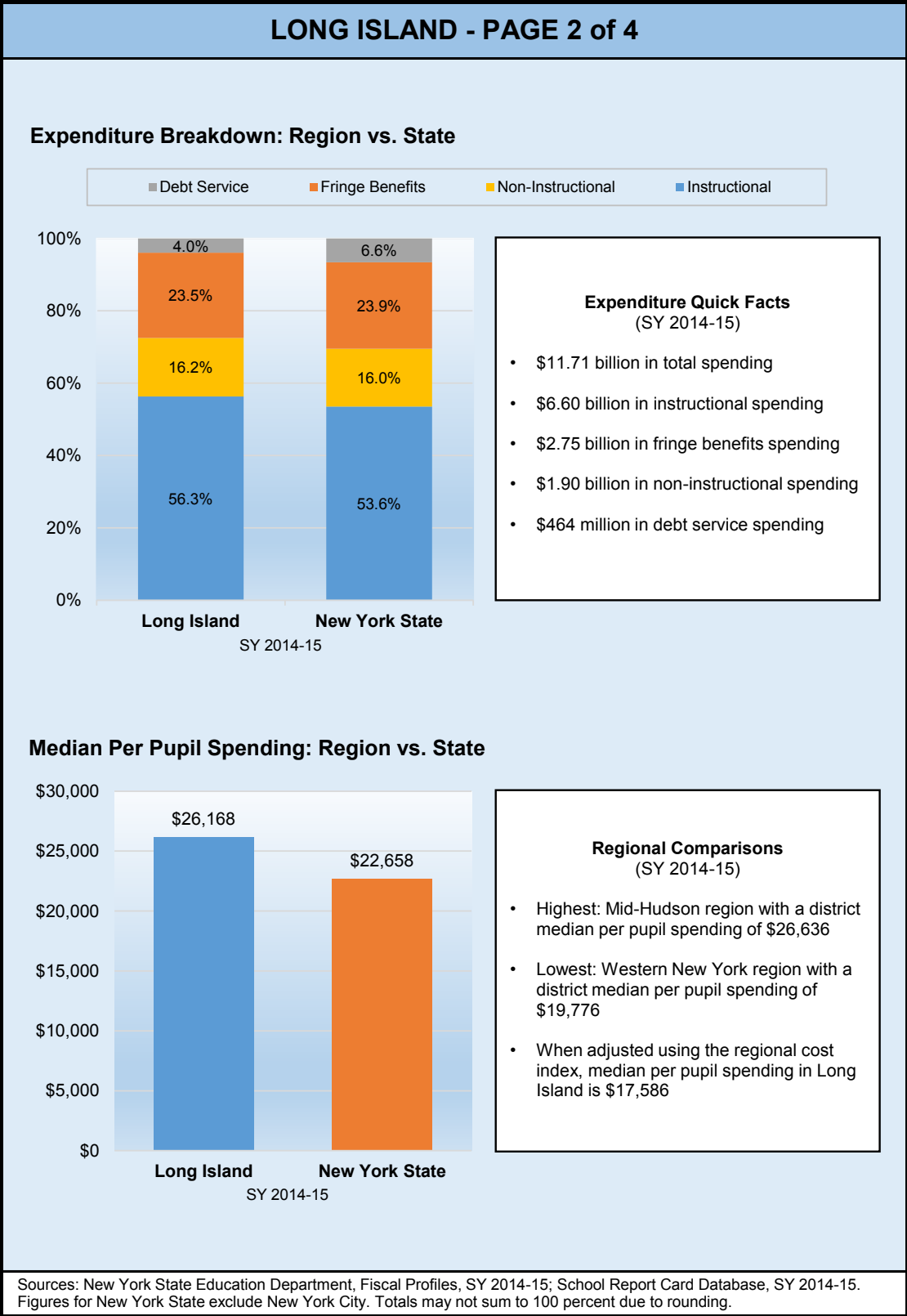
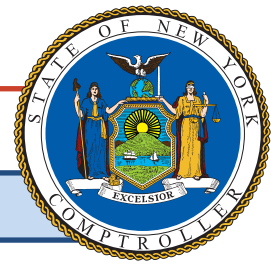

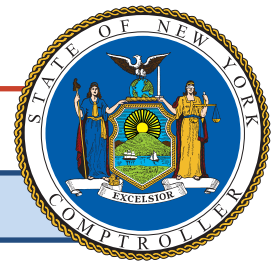

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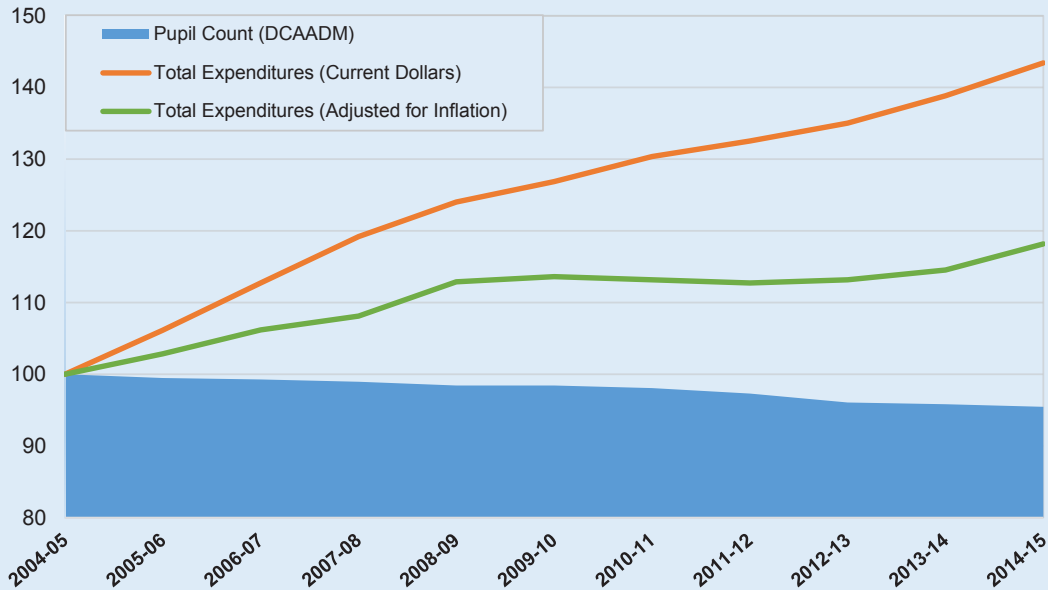
**Change in Regional Spending and Pupil Count: SY 2004-05 to 2014-15**

Total spending rose 43.4 percent in current dollars and 18.2 percent when adjusted for inflation.

The region lost students at a slower rate than the State as a whole, with a 4.6 percent drop in students, compared to a 7.6 percent drop statewide.

**Pupil Count and Total Expenditures Indexed: Region Over Time**

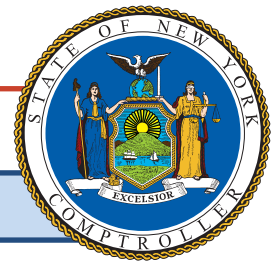
Pupils and Expenditures, SY 2004-05 = 100

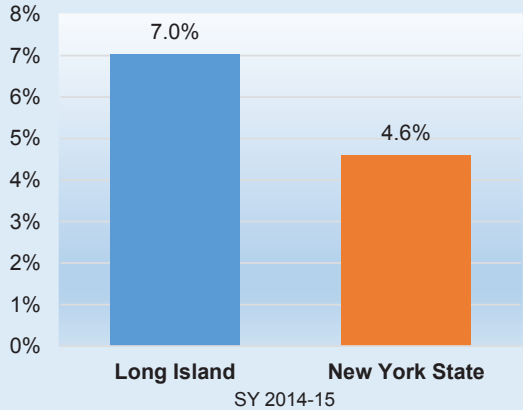

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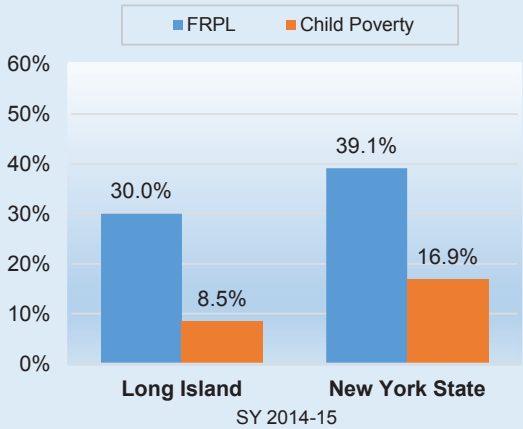
**Limited English Proficiency Rate: Region vs. State**

- Lowest: North Country region with a limited English proficiency rate of 0.4%

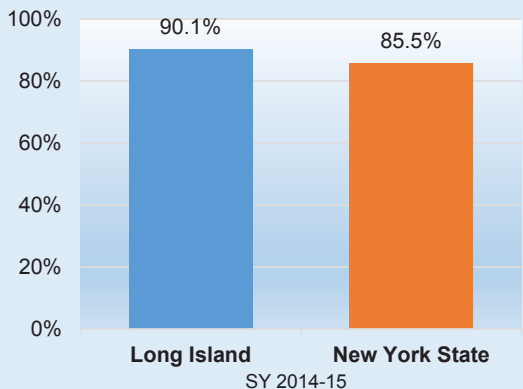
**Free or Reduced Priced Lunch (FRPL) and Child Poverty: Region vs. State**
